CHAPTER I

1.1 Background of the Research

The narrative text is a text that tells a story that has a series of chronological events that are interconnected. The narrative text consists of orientation, complication, resolution, and reorientation. The narrative text aims to entertain the reader. Narrative texts can be factual or imaginary stories.

There are various teaching strategies that teachers use to improve students' viewing and listening skills. The most used additional learning media. Learning media can clarify the presentation of messages and information to facilitate and improve learning processes (Munawaroh, 2019). The learning media commonly used is audio-visual media, such as video. The video provides a text narrative story with color images, motion pictures, and script. The video is one of the mediums to help improve, stimulate, and motivate of viewing and listening comprehension to understand the narrative text. These videos can also make the class conducive, fun, relaxed, not boring and make it easier to understand the material.

Previous researchers conducted research on the use of video films to improve students' listening comprehension, and the results showed that watching video films can help students' listening comprehension, students can absorb and relate to the material being studied. This shows that video films facilitate students to improve their listening comprehension (Yusrina, 2021).

The researcher chose SMAN 1 Mejobo Kudus research because based on the experience of researchers while carrying out a Teaching Internship (PLP II) at SMAN 1 Mejobo Kudus and teaching in class XI, the researcher found that when learning viewing and listening, many students feel bored so that it is difficult to understand the contents.
